


- Born in Murphreesboro, TN in 1878.
- Both of his parents were slaves.
- He completed the 7th grade.
- Never went to college.
- Married Minnie Womack in 1896. She died in 1932.
- Had 5 children
 - Two died in infancy, one son at 10.
 - One daughter is 1935, and his last child in 1964

- Married Laura Johnson in 1934. She was born in 1898 and died at 108 in 2007.
- He began preaching in 1897 but only on occasion as he also worked in a soap factory and owned a grocery store.
- That all changed in 1920 because of the generosity and foresight an extremely godly man.

• A.M. Burton

- Founder of the Life and Casualty Insurance Company.
- Began supporting
 Bro. Keeble in 1920.
- Supported him for the next 4 decades.



- His historical significance!
 - "Successfully bridged a racial divide in an important American religious movement prior to the Civil Rights Movement." Wikipedia.
 - According to historian Paul D. Phillips, Keeble embraced "the two-fold task of elevating Blacks by the proclamation of the Gospel and of establishing a bond of interracial fellowship through White support of his ministry."

- His Spiritual Nature.
 - Quiet and meditative.
 - Compassionate and forgiving.
 - Perseverance and honest.
 - Peaceful and calm.
 - No one's shortcomings were food for his conversation.
 - Pled with people for the necessity of commitment to Christ.

- Kingdom Contributions.
 - Well educated in the Scriptures despite only finishing the 7th grade.
 - Established over 200 congregations.
 - Baptized between 40,000-50,000 people.
 - Established several Christian schools including Southwest Christian College.

- Kingdom Contributions (cont.)
 - Never preached for a local congregation but continued preaching Gospel Meetings all over and in all types of establishments.
 - An incomparable debater
 - At 82 began traveling the world preaching-
 - Places included: Palestine, Nigeria, Ethiopia, India, Singapore, Korea, Hawaii, Los Angeles.

- Recognitions
 - Made an honorary chief of one Nigerian tribe.
 - Honored by Harding University with an honorary Doctorate of Law Degree 1965.
 - Tennessee Governor Frank Clement presented him with the highest state honor- The Colonel Aide-de-Camp
 - In 2000 the Christian Chronicle named Marshall Keeble the most influential preacher among churches of Christ in the decade of the 1940s.

- •He Preached his last sermon on April 17, 1968, 3 days before his death on April. 20, 1968 at age 89.
- His preaching career spanned 71 years.
- •Over 3000 people attended his funeral.
