

- Our text this morning is found in the midst of what many call the "Sermon on the Plain" that begins in Luke 6.
- Because of the many similarities to the "Sermon on the Mount" found in Matthew 5-7, some scholars believe these two instances are the same.
- Regardless, the content is worth our attention.

- Maybe, you have heard someone say something like, "that blessing just fell into my lap." Have you ever had that happen to you?
- Perhaps, some concept of this is found in our text as rendered by the ESV.
- The original idea for verse 38 is an old Eastern reference to the fold on the front of the outer robe that served as a pocket.

- However, the real meaning of the text resembles other passages in the Bible.
 - Proverbs 11:24-25
 - Proverbs 22:9
 - Malachi 3:10
 - II Cor. 9:6-8
 - Galatians 6:7

- In considering Jesus's teaching on how people should treat one another, we come to understand that our kindness is characterized in the following terms:
 - Good measure
 - Pressed down
 - Shaken together
 - Running over

- What do these things mean?
 - Good measure
 - A lot, a substantial amount
 - Pressed down
 - Pack it in
 - Shaken together
 - Sprinkle a little more to fill in all the gaps
 - Running over- Even extra

- This applies to what will be given to us when we give in this manner.
- But perhaps, we should think about this in terms of all the things that Jesus discussed in this sermon.
- LOVING ENEMIES
- JUDGMENT
- FORGIVENESS
- BENEVOLENCE

- Let's apply this method to all these things and watch the blessings just fall into our lap.
- Then we will truly come to understand the meaning of Acts 20:35, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."
