Matthew 19 & First Corinthians 7

- This is such an important topic.
- It is also a touchy subject.
- There are a few things that I want to set straight from the get go:
 - # 1- Although, God hates divorce, he does not hate the divorcee.
 - It is important for us to remember that God hates many things.- Proverbs 6:16-19

- He is just as disappointed and hurt when we give into any sin.
- He hates it when I am guilty of gossip or when I have impure thoughts. He hates unkindness and selfishness.
- But for whatever reason some people judge divorce as a weightier sin.

- #2-That a divorced person is not demoted to secondary Christian status.
 - For people to think that way is NONSENSE!!!!
 - Frustrations that divorced people have expressed when it comes to their church family:
 - -I just feel so guilty and ashamed.
 - -I am caught between looks of pity and accusation.

- -Where do I fit? It is awkward with the singles now but it is equally awkward being the third wheel with my married friends.
- -Where do I find time?
- Church, we have got to do a better job of helping these Christians through this horrible, hurtful, and for many of them humiliating experience.

- Where do I stand?
 - 1. I have been unfaithful which led to the divorce. Remain unmarried or reconcile (Matt. 19:9).
 - 2. My spouse was unfaithful which led to the divorce. Reconcile, remarry, or remain unmarried (Matt. 19:9).
 - 3. My spouse and I divorced for irreconcilable differences. (incompatible, personality, financial issues)-Stay unmarried or reconcile (I Cor. 7:10-11).

- Where do I stand?
 - 4. My spouse and I divorced because of abuse (physical, verbal, substance).
 - 5. My spouse and I divorced because of some type of illness (physical or mental).
 - 6. My spouse and I divorced because of some family tragedy.
- Each of these are the same as #3. (I Cor. 7:10-11)

- Where do I stand?
 - What about I Cor. 7:12-16 and an unbelieving spouse? Interpret in light of Matt. 19:9 and vs 16.
 - I realize that people will say, that you are being judgmental, insensitive and completely detached.
 - I can truly say that I don't always understand God's reasons or decisions. That doesn't mean I can teach against them or replace them.

- What should I remember?
 - That when interpreting these passages, there can be no contradictions. The Holy Spirit is not confused!!
 - What he guided Matthew to write from Jesus and what he guided Paul to write in his epistles will complement and supplement but never contradict.

- What should I remember?
 - We live in a fallen world and not everything in our life will be fair.
 - People will say, "It's not fair that I can't have a relationship like everyone else."
 - There are times when we will have to make sacrifices and experience unwanted circumstances. Think of Christ and Paul.
 - This may be the cross that you have to carry.

- What should I remember?
 - Don't let sexuality and physical relationships become your idol.
 - We've done that in America. The liberation of sexuality in all its forms has become the focus of American democracy.
 - Sex, the one thing that we can't live without, and shouldn't have to. Therefore, we must devise a way so that everyone can. That's not scriptural.

- What should I remember?
 - I can't do it. In other words, "God, you are not enough."
 - But, that is not the case. It can be done!! Listen to Christ and Paul again:
 - Matt. 19:10-12
 - I Cor. 7:10-12
 - They wouldn't say it if it weren't possible.

- What should I do?
 - POUR YOURSELF INTO THE WORK OF THE KINGDOM.- Matt. 19:12
 - FOCUS ON YOUR FAMILY.- I Cor. 7:13-16
 - WORK ON BEING HOLY IN BODY AND SPIRIT.
 - I Cor. 7:32-34
 - GIVE YOUR UNDIVIDED DEVOTION TO THE LORD.
 - I Cor. 7:35
