1. Why Is it called "The Lord's Supper"?

- It is a feast, a memorial, a remembrance that honors our Lord
- 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
- Jesus Himself instituted it on the night he was betrayed
- Matthew 26:26-28

2. Are there other names for the Lord's Supper?

- "Communion" 1 Corinthians 10:16
- "Breaking of the Bread"- 1 Corinthians 10:16; Acts 2:42; Acts 20:7
- "Table of the Lord"- 1 Corinthians 10:21

3. What does the Lord's Supper mean?

- This memorial is a reminder that the Son of God became flesh and blood; He suffered; and He was crucified on the cross of Calvary
- Two elements of the Lord's Supper (Unleavened Bread and Fruit of the vine)
- Jesus is present with us
- Time of fellowship with other Christians
- It gives us strength

4. Who is to take the Lord's Supper?

- Acts 20:7
- Acts 11:26
- Act 2:41-43
- 1 Corinthians 10:16-17
 Disciples, Christians, Those in the one body of Christ

5. Why do we observe the Lord's Supper every Sunday?

- Acts 20:7- The practice is to meet on the first day of the week
- The Lord's Supper is observed on the first day of the week
- Paul waited a week in Troas for the church to come together
- 1 Corinthians 16:2 (every week)
