Matthew 14:22-33

- In this short section of scriptures, which tells a unique story of Jesus and his disciples, the word immediately is found three times.
- I say unique because even though it is recorded in Mark 6 and John 6, Matthew is the only writer that discusses Peter's involvement on this occasion.
- What do we learn from these "immediately" comments?

HE MADE THEM GET INTO THE BOAT

- This directive follows hard on the heels of Jesus's feeding of the 5000.
- Why did he make them get in the boat?
 - Maybe so they could get away from the crowd?
 - Maybe so he could have some alone time to pray?

HE MADE THEM GET INTO THE BOAT

- Why did he make them get in the boat?
 - Or maybe, it was because they needed to go somewhere else to try and help people.
 - Marks says they were headed to Bethsaida.
 John says they were going to Capernaum. They landed in Gennesaret.

HE MADE THEM GET INTO THE BOAT

 When should we get going to help and save people?

IMMEDIATELY!!!!

Immediately.....

HE TOLD HIS DISCIPLES TO NOT BE AFRAID

- Between 3 a.m. and 6 a.m. as a tempest was tossing the boat in the middle of the sea, Jesus came walking to them.
 - At first they were terrified and cried out in fear, "It is a ghost!"
 - Jesus immediately said, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid."

HE TOLD HIS DISCIPLES TO NOT BE AFRAID

 When can you get comfort from Jesus for your fears and concerns?

HE REACHED OUT HIS HAND TO PETER

- Peter makes an amazing request.
- He walks on the water until he takes his eyes off of Jesus. Once that happens and he begins to look at his surroundings, he becomes afraid and begins to sink.
 - He cried out, "Lord, save me" and Jesus does.
