II Samuel 18:29

"IS THE YOUNG MAN ABSALOM SAFE?"

Our text demonstrates the concern of a parent for a child even when that child has repeatedly mistreated the parent and behaved badly.

- Consider just a few of the examples:
 - This son was a murderer.
 - This son dealt hypocritically with his father.
 - This son rebelled against his father.
- Yet, David said "Deal gently for my sake with the young man." (18:5)

- David should have thought about that question when he was selecting a mother for him.
 - His mother was Maacah, daughter of Talmai, King of Geshur (II Sam. 3:3)
 - She belonged to a heathen people.
 - David violated God's law in marrying her (Deut. 7:1-8) and was prompted by political ambition.

- David should have thought about that question when looking on Bathsheba with lust.
 - No young man is safe when his father is engaged in matters of this kind!
 - No wonder Absalom was deceitful.
 - Your child is not likely to find a Father in God unless he finds something of God in his father.

- David should have thought about that question when he consider the training Absalom should have received.
 - There isn't the least bit of evidence that David gave time and attention to training Absalom.
 - Like many people, David's time was monopolized by the affairs of state...not family.

- David should have thought about that question when he consider the training Absalom should have received.
 - A little boy summed it up perfectly, "Parents are just babysitters for God."
 - Eph. 6:4
 - No example of discipline is given.

"IS THE YOUNG MAN ABSALOM SAFE?" Was the young man Absalom safe?

NOT AT ALL!!!!

- How could he be? He had rebelled against God's anointed.
- How can any boys or girls who rebel against God's anointed be safe?
- Nothing could be done now for Absalom.
 - Is your child safe?

"IS THE YOUNG MAN ABSALOM SAFE?"

- Is your child safe as long as:
 - You are not giving him/her the advantage of a Christian example?
 - You fail to train him/her in the way of the Lord.
 - Religion occupies a secondary place in your home.
- Youth ministers and preachers can't work miracles.
