

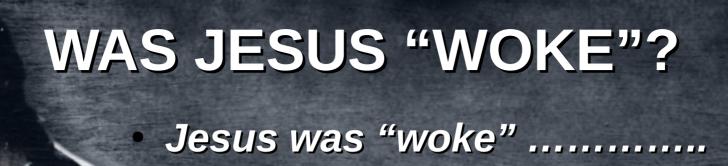
Of course, the original meaning is the past tense of wake which means "to emerge from a state of sleep."

But Jesus died for all the world and is no respecter of persons-Acts 10:34.

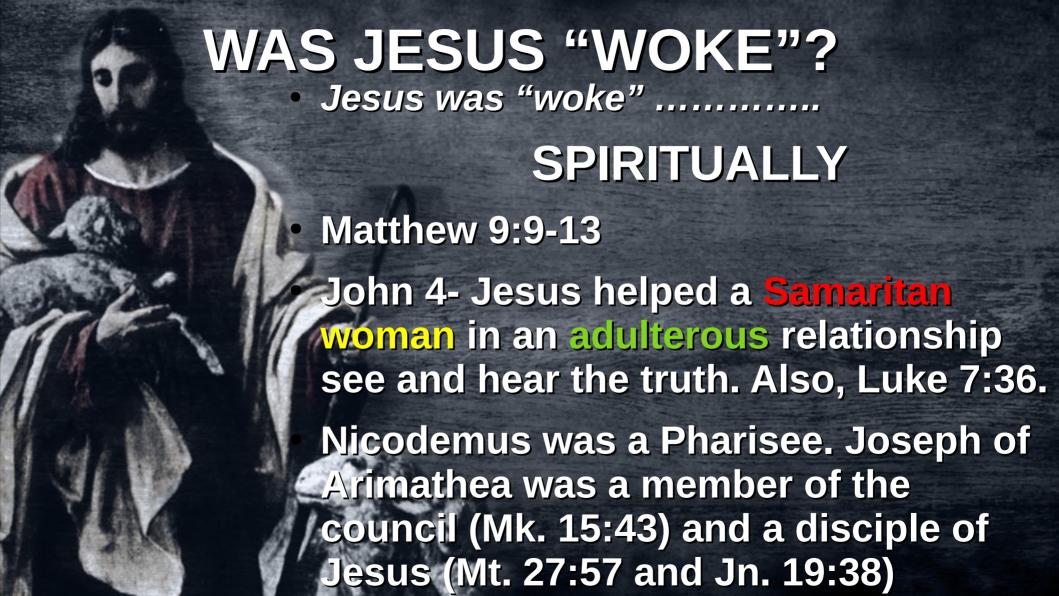
