GALATIANS 5:1-4

 As a point of introduction, it is important for us to establish the intended audience of Paul's epistle.

He addresses this letter to the churches of Galatia and more specifically the Christians that made up these churches.

This is apparent by Paul's multiple references to his readers as brothers/brethren.

- An understanding of this fact will go a long way in helping us settle the issue under consideration today.
 - The history of this doctrine seems to have originated with a man referred to as St. Augustine in the 3^{rd} century.
 - It was more fully developed by John Calvin in the 16th century becoming a major tenet of his theological teachings.

- The epistle to the Galatians provides both direct and implied teachings that stand in opposition to this doctrine.
 - Today, we are going to examine those through a variety of texts and several spiritual premises advanced by the apostle Paul.

Paul shows the fallacy of this doctrine through...

DIRECT STATEMENT

Galatians 5:4

 Paul specifically tells the Christians in Galatia that if they seek justification by the law, then they have fallen from grace!!!

Look at Gal. 4:8-11; 5:7

Paul shows the fallacy of this doctrine through...

DEDUCTIVE REASONING

Why would Paul be concerned with their turning away from the Gospel he preached?

- In fact, once they were converted why even write about obeying sound doctrine or issues of sin.
 - Just send them a happy, hope your well letter.

Paul shows the fallacy of this doctrine through...

DEDUCTIVE REASONING

Why would Paul insist that they abandon the works of the flesh?

Why warn them over and over about the doom designated for those who commit such things?

Gal. 5:19-21

Paul shows the fallacy of this doctrine through...

DEDUCTIVE REASONING

Why would Paul spend so much time not just in this epistle but in other epistles emphasizing the necessity of walking according to the Spirit?- Gal. 5:22-25

Why would Paul encourage the restoration of transgressors?- Gal. 6:1

Paul shows the fallacy of this doctrine through...

DETERMINED APPLICATION

Matthew 28:19-20

Paul believed and practiced what Jesus said about making disciples.

Being saved in God's family is about.... admission & action/initiation & involvement.

• Conclusion:

Please understand that in attempting to deconstruct "once saved, always saved," we are not trying to destroy anyone's confidence or assurance that they have in Christ.

Continue to walk in the light....walk with the Spirit....walk in faithful obedience and nothing will be able to separate us from our Savior.
