- Matt. 6:5, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness for they will be filled."
- UNDERSTANDING OUR HUNGER
 - What is life about?
 - Search for purpose.
 - Calendar is full, I have a little money, enjoying life, taking a vacation.
 - I must be living a life of purpose.

- But really we have no idea where we are going in life but we are going there fast.
- We are just doing our time!!!!
- We must understand that the wisdom of this world cannot satisfy life's hunger.
- Look at our track record:

- Broken relationships
- Scarred lives
- Domestic violence
- Loneliness
- Shattered dreams
- Substance abuse
- Abandoned children

Principle #1

"We were made to live in relationship with God."

- To ignore this fact is to wind up starving spiritually.
- Sometimes we confuse our spiritual hunger for relationship w/God as just a hunger for relationship in general.

- What's the result:
 - Chasing after people that aren't good for us.
 - Trying to find a perfect relationship with other people.
 - Filling the void with a parent, child, or spouse.
 - These relationships will lead to disappointment. Why?
 - Because there are no perfect human relationships.

- Alert! Alert!- There is no person that can make you or me feel satisfied!!!!
 - Scripture never tells us to love another person with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength.

 That love is reserved for God alone.
 - In fact, I would suggest that if you are struggling in an earthly relationship then the deeper cause of that problem is that you are struggling in your relationship with God.

Principle #2

Knowing about God is not necessarily knowing God

- We sometimes grade our Christianity (relationship with God) by how many Bible facts I can memorize or how many scriptures I can quote.
- "The goal of Scripture isn't minds filled with facts about God but hearts that are using those facts to be full of His presence."

Principle #3

Don't be satisfied with pyrite when you can have gold

- Instead of craving a vibrant relationship with God we settle for a house, a family, a few friends, a job, etc.
- Story of the boy who killed his father.
 - "I want my father, I want my father."
- The is the same desperate cry of the world

- Listen to some testimonials
 - "O God, you are my God; early will I seek you; my soul thirsts for you, my body longs for you, in a dry and weary land, where there is no water."-David (Ps. 63:1)
 - "Your name and renown are the desire of our hearts. My soul yearns for you in the night; in the morning my spirit longs for you."- Isaiah (Is. 26:8b,9).

"Whom have I in heaven but you?

And earth has nothing I desire besides you.

My flesh and my heart may fail,

But God is the strength of my heart

and my portion forever."- (Psalm 73:25-26).

BOLD LIFE

- To speak unpopular truth- Acts 4:7-13a
- To defy unrighteous demands- Acts 4:18-21
- To accept uncomfortable consequences- Acts 4:23-31- (Listen to this beautiful prayer).
- To demonstrate unwavering faith- Acts 4:33-37
