I and II Peter

- Introduction:
 - Peter identifies himself as the author and as an apostle of Jesus Christ.
 - He addresses this letter to the "elect exiles of the Dispersion."
 - We see a similar opening statement in James.
 - Peter is referring to Christians who feel displaced in this present evil world.

Holiness

- He begins by discussing the process of one becoming Holy.
 - Foreknowledge of God- Eph. 1:3-4
 - Sanctification in the Spirit- John 17:17
 - Obedience to Jesus Christ- Rom. 6:15-17
 - Sprinkling with his blood.- I John 1:7

- Hopefulness
 - The means of this hope.
 - Through the resurrection of Jesus
 - The permanence of this hope.
 - Imperishable, undefiled, and unfading.
 - The certainty of this hope.
 - Guarded by God's power.

- Peter's purpose is to continue to encourage the Christians to remain faithful even in the face of trials.
- He does this by reminding them about several things:
 - They will have honor and salvation.
 - They are privileged with knowledge others have longed to have. These former prophets labored to serve the interests of the current Christians.

- Two points of interest in this paragraph concerning their salvation:
 - The involvement of the prophets and serving a greater purpose. Their dedication to the cause.
 - Things into which angels long to look.
 - The idea is of them stooping to look.
 - Reminiscent of Peter at Jesus's grave or the cherubim on the mercy seat looking down.

- In view of the trials and persecutions they were potentially going to face, Peter gives them the formula for success in their current sojourn. Have a......
 - Mind of Action
 - Mind of Awareness
 - Mind of Anticipation and Joy
