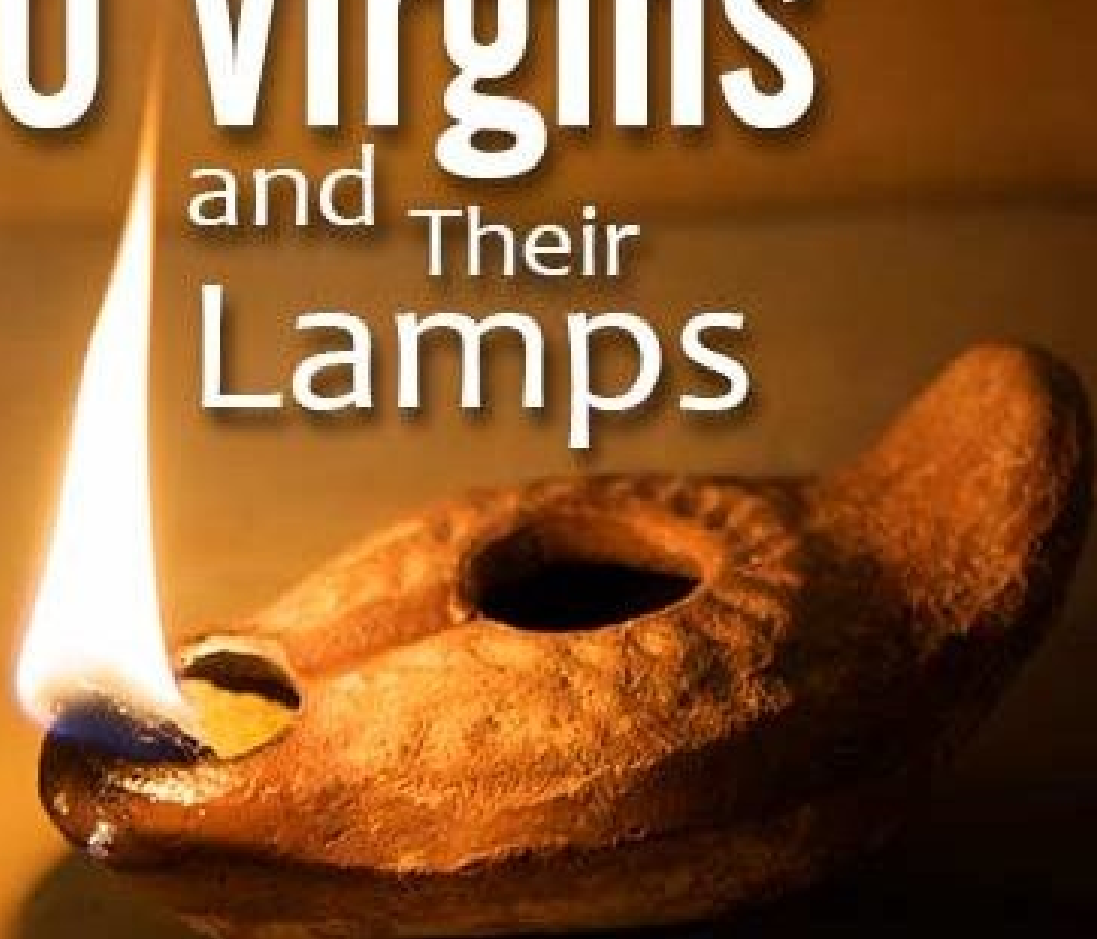


10 Virgins and Their Lamps

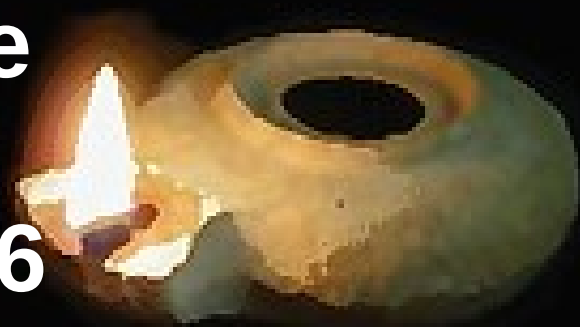
TEXT: Matthew 25:1-13

him? Matt. 7:21

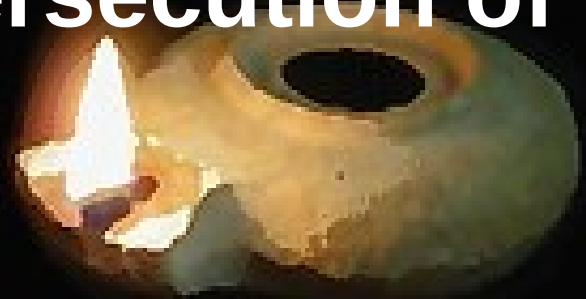


TEN VIRGINS

- WERE SINCERE IN THEIR DESIRE TO GO TO THE MARRIAGE FEAST.**
- Paul was sincere in his persecution of the church, thinking that his conduct pleased God.**



TEN VIRGINS

TEXT: Matthew 25:1-13

According to Jesus's parable, all ten.....

– WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR OWN ENTRANCE

– Could not get in on mom or dad's faith.

– Could not get in by their friend's



TEN VIRGINS

TEXT: Matthew 25:1-13

- Five virgins made the one mistake of not doing what they needed to do to be prepared.**
- They even regretted not being prepared.**
- The sad news- They were not allowed into the feast.**
