KINGDOM PARABLES





















- All of us are familiar with this parable.
 - We've heard about the enormous debt that one servant owed.
 - We've heard about the kindness of the King.
 - We've heard about how harsh the forgiven servant was to his fellow servant.

- In this lesson, let's examine some specifics that may make us feel uneasy.
- Today, we need to view this parable from a personal perspective and not, what I imagine, is the more generic approach.
- This parable should hit home a lot more than we allow it.

- WE ARE THE UNMERCIFUL SERVANT!!!!
- We don't like to believe that.
- · We don't associate ourselves with it.
- We don't like to be made to feel uncomfortable or evil.
- BUT, WE ARE.
- We need to be a reminded of this.

- I have also always thought of this parable as the ungrateful servant.
- Ungratefulness to his master is demonstrated in several ways:
 - Do we pay attention to the fact that the servant at some point was given 10,000 talents? All indications are that he had not attempted to pay any of it back.

- Ungratefulness to his master is demonstrated in several ways: (cont.)
 - Not to mention the fact that the master forgave him of this enormous debt.
 - Then, the servant proceeds to have his fellow servant arrested for a rather insignificant debt.
 Do we consider how this also affected his master? He has cost his master a servant!

- We are like this ungrateful servant in that we.....
 - DON'T APPRECIATE HOW MUCH WE OWE GOD
- We are the ones with the 10,000 talent debt.
- Instead, in many cases, we go through life and behave as though God owes us something.
- We forget that every good thing that we enjoy is a blessing from Him- James 1:17.

WASTE THE BLESSINGS OUR KING HAS GIVEN US

- What good are we doing with our blessings?
- I realize that it is impossible to pay God back for what he has done for us; but, is there no feeling of indebtedness?
- We've become very good at accepting and pretty bad about giving back.

MISTREAT OUR FELLOW SERVANTS

- Instead of forgiving or attempting to find out what may be negatively affecting our brother/sister, we just look at how we are being affected.
- Have we ever been guilty of mistreating a fellow Christian (servant of God) to the point that they are no longer serving?
- Are we are guilty of backbiting, gossiping, & judging.
